## Notes:

This document has been updated to reflect the research and development work completed by FFT Education Datalab ${ }^{1}$ which acknowledges that Alternative Provision (AP) schools and special schools are poorly served by the current published measures of pupil attainment at the end of Key Stage 4. Their report on Key Stage 4 attainment measures can be found here. This includes school-level data for larger schools. There is also a second report on calculating other quality measures for the AP sector: attendance, re-integration and post-16 destinations.

## Pupil population

- Number of pupils are those that finished key stage 4


## Absence

- Overall absence and persistent absence figures for those that finished key stage 4


## English and mathematics

- Average grade from baseline on entry is the average of the GCSE grade points for all pupils that sat the GCSE baseline test on entry to Alternative Provision and were entered for the GCSE exam at the end of KS4. A grade $U$ is assigned zero points.

- Average grade from GCSE Result is the average of the GCSE grade points for all pupils that sat the GCSE exam at the end of KS4 and who also achieved a grade in the baseline test on entry. A grade $U$ is assigned zero points.

$$
\text { Average GCSE result grade }=\frac{\text { Total GCSE Result points }}{\text { Number of pupils }}
$$

- A pupil must have achieved a grade 4 or 5 or above in both GCSE English and in GCSE Maths to be included in the grade 4 and grade 5 measures.
- A GCSE pass is a grade 9 to 1 , a grade $U$ is not a pass.


## Qualifications and attainment

- The average number of qualifications includes any level - Level 1, Level 2, entry level, functional skills.
- The percentage entered for at least 5 qualifications is at any level and regardless of whether they passed or not.


## Approved qualifications and progress 8

- Progress 8 and attainment 8 figures are calculated only using the approved DfE qualifications for 2019 and follow the DfE methodology.
- Progress 8 subject groups have been included to show which area (linked to the qualifications taken) had the biggest impact on the overall progress 8 score. For example, it is likely that 3 EBacc qualifications will not have been taken. It is likely that English Literature will not have been taken and therefore the English attainment score will not have been double weighted.
